I will be applying my \$1,000.00 that I received as Mayor of the Year
toward the Public Works Building fund.

The Public Works Building workshop was a productive full-house meeting. We need to work smarter not harder. The Public Works deserves a new building. I liked the idea of having a conditional use restriction placed on the project to not allow the salt shed to move there. The deed only allows a municipal use for the site. It was never stated that the former Reinhard site was a park. Council had the foresight to remove the hazardous building before someone got hurt. Even with the site development proposed, the field will remain. I took offense to the comments about not doing enough for the children of the community. I challenge anyone to find a better park system in a municipality of Hellertown's size. The Borough has received funding to provide pedestrian safety improvements along Main Street. It is a PennDOT road and they will not lower the speed limit. Council is listening to the community.

Mr. Rieger- I would prefer to have our engineer and Police Department look into the matter before we make any decisions.

Motion made by Philip Weber to table this matter until the May 6, 2019, meeting. Mr. Russo will touch base with the Community Center to get their input and the Hellertown Police and Mr. Smith will look into the possibility of making a portion of Saucon Street two-way. Motion carried 7-0.

6. Discussion on Main Street Lehigh Valley Grant Suggestions- Council Action

Mr. Rieger- We have been very successful in receiving grant funding from the Main Street Lehigh Valley Grant Program. In the past, it has been used to purchase site furnishings, the kiosk, etc. There has been discussion of applying for a grant to cover the cost of a mural. There would be a community contest for the design and Color Wheel Creations in conjunction with a local business would create the mural.

Mr. Stauffer- The plus side of a mural is the content. On the flip side, they are a target for graffiti and people become tired of it after a few years and then it falls into disrepair.

The consensus of the Council was to have staff come back with other recommendations for the grant application at the May 6, 2019, meeting.



Hello,

My name is Kristine Moser and I live at 425 Delaware Ave in Hellertown. There was a post on Facebook, I believe in the Valley Voice, that mentioned you are voting on turning the one way portion of E. Saucon Street into a two-way road from Northampton Street to Rentzheimer.

I think that is a really good idea and am very supportive of East Saucon Street becoming available for two-way traffic. I do have one concern/suggestion. The area of East Saucon Street immediately in front of the Community Center is very narrow even as a one-way road because cars are allowed to park on both sides of the road right there. If cars are allowed to park on both sides of the road, even just for drop-offs only for the daycare/senior center, it will be impossible for two-way traffic. It is difficult to get through that part now as a one-way when someone is dropping off/picking up a child at the daycare. And across the street from the community center is the only available parking (I think) for the couple of houses that are right there, so perhaps the Community Center can move their designated drop-off parking to the Northampton Street side of their building? Northampton Street is much wider than Saucon Street anyway and would be more convenient for through traffic to get around the cars trying to drop off/pick up at the daycare anyway and it really isn't much longer of a walk for the daycare folks.

I think East Saucon Street could easily accommodate two-way traffic for those two blocks if parking was only permitted on one side of the street. Otherwise, it would be difficult for cars to get past each other.

Dear Council Members,

I'm unable to attend tonight's meeting, but I have concerns about the creation of a two-way street on one-way portions -- or all? -- or E. Saucon St.

I will need to see a good traffic study's results to make any truly informed statements about the viability of the idea.

Meanwhile, I'm concerned about the way this idea was introduced -- seemingly out of the blue at a meeting that was supposed to be solely devoted to the Reinhard proposal and yet not presented in a way that offered any link to the Reinhard proposal. Did I miss something?

To me and others I've spoken to in our neighborhood, this particular two-way idea seemed vaguely and rather bizarrely retaliatory, and not offered out of any set of arguments in the public interest. I don't recall hearing the idea come up ever in recent history.

I myself can see interesting potential benefits to a two-way street — and big drawbacks. But this plan seemed more of a hostile gesture than an informed, sincere proposal.

HELLERTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORT

March 2019

This is the monthly report for the Hellertown Police Department from March 1st through March 31st, 2019.

During the month of March the Police received 461 calls for service. We did receive 10 Domestic/Assault, 4 Theft / Receiving Stolen Property, 2 Fraud, 1 Sex Offense and 9 traffic collision calls. We wrote 134 citations.

The Police Department filed 44 charges including 23 for Narcotics Possession, 10 for DUI, 4 for Theft and Receiving Stolen Property, 3 for Assault / Domestic, and 3 for Fraud.

This March was really busy for us. Our call and arrests were largely increased from last March. We received 140 more calls for service and filed 25 more charges than last year. Updates have been completed by all officers and we are now doing firearms qualifications and training. Our last blockwatch went really well at 650 Northampton Street. We have met regarding National Night Out and are in the process of planning the event for 2019. Any questions feel free to stop in or call.

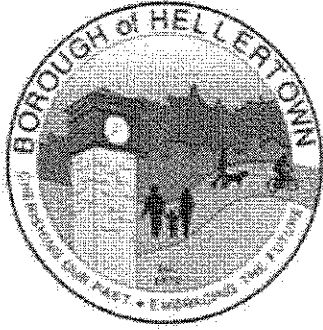
