1. Discussion on Outstanding Liens Collection Policy

- 2. Approval to Reject All Bids for Signalized Crosswalks on Main Street Project and Crosswalk Improvements on Water Street Project- Council Action
- Authorization to Rebid Signalized Crosswalks on Main Street Project and Crosswalk Improvements on Water Street Project- Council Action

Mr. Smith- We received only one bid for each project. The bids came in at \$319.680.00. The grant award is for \$219,155.00. We are recommending rebidding the project in two packages and having the decorative crosswalk installed at Main and Water Streets only. The other intersections would be Thermotaped.

Motion made by Andrew Hughes, seconded by Earl Hill, to reject all bids and rebid with the recommended changes. Motion carried 7-0.

#### X. New Business

Outstanding Obligations- Approval of Payments

Motion made by Philip Weber, seconded by Earl Hill, to approve the payments. Motion carried 7-0.

2. Presentation and Adoption of 2020 Preliminary General, Sanitation, Fire, Liquid Fuels, and Capital Budgets- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- There have been no significant changes since the last budget session. Because the Borough received a TASA grant, we will need to conduct a single audit. The estimate from our auditing firm is \$3,500.00. I would like to include this in the audit for next year. Also, another employee has selected the opt-out for health coverage so that balance will change slightly. Council will need to make a motion on the preliminary budget and authorize its advertisement. It will be on

the agenda for final adoption at the December 2, 2019, Council Meeting.

Mr. Rieger noted that there is no proposed tax increase.

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Philip Weber, to adopt 2020 Preliminary Budget. Motion carried 7-0.

3. Authorization to Advertise 2020 Preliminary Budget- Council Action

Motion made by Philip Weber, seconded by Earl Hill, to advertise the 2020 Preliminary Budget. Motion carried 7-0.

Mr. Rieger- There is a new Pennsylvania law that states that a tax ordinance is not necessary if there is no change in the millage. The Borough can do this by resolution.

4. Applicant is Seeking Approval for Development Under the Flexible Redevelopment Ordinance- Council Action

Mr. Smith- The FRO was created in the Highway Commercial and part of the Mixed Zone to expand redevelopment. Without the FRO, the Highway Commercial Zoning District does not allow for residential development. First, the applicant must ask Council to proceed with the plan under the FRO. The next step is to go through the land development process before Planning Commission.

Derrick Herman and Dano Guerrieri were present to discuss the plan. The plan is to combine one vacant lot and three residential lots at Kichline Avenue and Gum Street into one lot and build 28 apartment units and 2 commercial offices. Our plan allows for 50 parking spaces. We will with need relief from the Zoning Hearing Board or to finalize a lease with a neighbor for the additional required parking spaces. We will also require a SALDO waiver of the shade tree requirement. When we presented to the Planning Commission, they seemed alright with us planting 24 on site and the remainder being donated to plant elsewhere in the Borough.

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Mr. Weber expressed his concern with traffic flow on Gum Street and recommending either making it one-way or widening the alley.

Mr. Earl Hill wants them to secure the parking agreement as a contingency.

Chief Maguire was present and noted that without improvements to Gum alley, an emergency vehicle will not make the turn.

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by Andrew Hughes, to allow applicant to proceed under the FRO contingent upon reconfiguring the entrance to allow emergency vehicles and moving trucks to enter, reconstructing Gum Street, and obtaining a shared parking agreement for the additional required spaces. Motion carried 7-0.

5. Award Bid for Compost Center Pole Building to Dutchman Contracting, LLC, in the Amount of \$57,921.00- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- Two bids were received for this project. The Committee is recommending awarding the bid to Dutchman Contracting, LLC. The Committee would also like to include the alternate of a sliding door on the North wall for an additional cost of \$2,475.00.

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by Michael McKenna, to award the Compost Center Pole Building Project to Dutchman Contracting, LLC, in the amount of \$57,921.00 plus the alternate sliding door at \$2,475.00. Motion carried 7-0.

6. Authorization to Hire Tracie Drayton as Cleaning Personnel at a Rate of \$12.00 Per Hour. Contingent Upon Successfully Completed Background Check- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- Council authorized staff to advertise for the cleaning personnel position. It has been duly advertise. Staff is recommending hiring Tracie Drayton for the position.

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Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Earl Hill, to hire Tracie Drayton as cleaning personnel at a rate of \$12.00 per hour contingent upon successful completion of background check. Motion carried 7-0.
