1. Outstanding Obligations- Approval of Payments

 - a. Adoption of Resolution 21-09, Authorization to Submit Application for Traffic Signal at Saucon Rail Trail and West Walnut Street- Council Action

Mr. Smith- The Rapid Flashers installed will be the same type as were just installed on Main Street.

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Earl Hill, to adopt Resolution 21-09, adopt Resolution 21-10, and authorize traffic signal maintenance agreement for Walnut Street Rail Trail crossing. Motion carried 7-0.

3. 2022 Non-Uniform Pension Plan Minimum Municipal Obligation- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- The 2022 Non-Uniform MMO is \$22,500.00.

Motion made by Andrew Hughes, seconded by Gil Stauffer, to approve the 2022 Non-Uniform MMO. Motion carried 7-0.

4. 2022 Uniform Pension Plan Minimum Municipal Obligation- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- The Uniform MMO is covered by State Aid.

Motion made by Gil Stauffer, seconded by Andrew Hughes, to approve the 2022 Uniform MMO. Motion carried 7-0.

5. Appointment of Larry O'Donnell to Planning Commission to Fill Term Expiring December 31, 2021- Council Action

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Matthew Marcincin, to appoint Larry O'Donnell to the Planning Commission. Motion carried 7-0.

6. Discussion on Request for Waiver of Sidewalk Installation at 30 West High Street- Council Action

Gary Ramunni, owner, requested an exemption to the required sidewalk installation due to the steep embankment of his property, that it would require the loss of the entire side yard, could compromise the retaining wall in the back of the property, there are no other sidewalks on that side of Washington Street, and the required new retaining wall and sidewalk would be cost prohibitive. The property is currently under an Agreement of Sale.

Mr. Earl Hill- I drove by the property and do not think we should make the owner install sidewalks. There are no sidewalks on his side of the street and the retaining wall required is cost prohibitive.

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by Gil Stauffer, to grant exemption for sidewalk installation at this time. Motion carried 7-0.

 Approval of Saucon Valley Diamond Sports Request to Install Enclosed Dugouts, Install Fencing Around Farm Field, and Install New Batting Cages-Council Action

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by James Hill, to deny request to install fencing and table remaining items until plans are presented. Motion carried 7-0.

8. Authorization to Pay Invoice #5 to TPD for the Main Street Safety Project in the Amount of \$9,858.48- Council Action

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Earl Hill, to pay Invoice #5 to TPD in the amount of \$9,858.48. Motion carried 7-0.

9. Approval of Donation Request to Saucon Valley Spirit Parade- Council Action

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by Michael McKenna, to donate \$1,000.00 to the Saucon Valley Spirit Parade. Donation is to be taken from the contingency fund. Motion carried 7-0.

 Approval of Donation of Smith Co. Super Rake, Model 13-119, Serial #0868, to Saucon Valley Diamond Sports- Council Action

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Earl Hill, to approve the donation of a super rake to Saucon Valley Diamond Sports. Motion carried 7-0.

11. Discussion and Authorization to Complete Boundary and Hard Topographical Survey of Farm Property- Council Action

Mr. Rieger- Lower Saucon Township is requiring the survey prior to the sale.

Mr. Smith- The cost is about \$10,000.00 and could take 3-4 weeks to complete.

Council was not in favor of the expenditure.

Mr. Smith- The Borough could execute the agreement of sale but make it contingent upon the buyer paying for and completing the survey.

Motion made by Gil Stauffer to table this item and add the sale of Borough owned property contingent upon Agreement of Sale and completed survey. Motion carried 7-0.

12. Discussion on Property Maintenance and Abandoned Car Enforcement

Mr. Rieger- Council has been receiving a lot of complaints regarding property maintenance issues and junked or abandoned vehicles. We would like staff to step-up enforcement.

Chief Shupp- The police department began our annual enforcement drive on August 24, 2021. The town is divided amongst the officers. There have been 18 vehicles tagged. We have had 100 percent compliance.

 Approval of Request to Close One Lane of East Thomas Avenue on September 25, 2021, for Event- Council Action

Mrs. Hartranft- Saylor's has asked to be able to close one lane of East Thomas Avenue for an event.

Council felt both lanes up to the alley should be closed for the event for safety.

Motion made by Earl Hill, seconded by Gil Stauffer, to approve the closure of the first block of East Thomas Avenue for the event. Motion carried 7-0.

14. Award Bid for Dimmick Park Swale Greening- Council Action

Mr. Smith- This project is to remove the asphalt lining the channel, replace with vegetation, and one year of maintenance. We received two bids. The low bidder was Kobalt Construction in the amount of \$162,394.00.

Mrs. Hartranft noted that this would include the removal of some of the pine trees but not all. Since the roots are being disturbed, the remainder should also be removed but the cost won't be covered by the grant.

Mr. Smith- The Borough could do a change order and reduce the scope to cover the cost of removing the remainder of the trees. If this causes a delay, it could push the project back into 2022.

Motion made by Michael McKenna, seconded by Gil Stauffer, to award the base bid and all three alternates to Kobalt Construction in the amount of \$162,394.00 and to look into change order for tree removal. Motion carried 7-0.

15. Award Bid for Walnut Street RRFB- Council Action

Mr. Smith- We received 6 bids. The bids include the installation of rapid flashers, crosswalk, ADA connection to the Gristmill, and an alternate of ADA parking area. The low bidder was DePaul. They did not include items in their bid and have asked to withdraw their bid.

Motion made by Andrew Hughes, seconded by Earl Hill, to reject low bidder due to lack of responsiveness.

Mr. Smith- The next lowest bidder was Kobalt Construction for a total bid of \$139,180.00.
